

SPRING CLEAN-UP 2018

The Annual Bauline Spring Clean-up will kick off at **8:30 am on Saturday morning 23 JUNE 2018** as follows:

- 0830 Gather at the Town Hall, 2 Memorial Park Place
Announcements and Safety Brief
- 0900 Dispatch five teams as follows:
- Team 1: Bauline Line Extension, (end at Tommy White's Pond)
 - Team 2: Pouch Cove Line Boundary,
 - Team 3: Tommy White's Pond
 - Team 4: Bauline United Church, and
 - Team 5: The Wharf.
- All teams to work towards the Town Hall
- 1130 Gather back at the Town Hall
Children prize give away
- 1200 BBQ and Music

The Contractor will collect bulk items commencing **Monday 25 JUNE 2017**.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Ensure that all your bulk waste is out by the side of the road no later than Sunday Evening **24 JUNE 2017**;
- Metals will have to be separated from bulk goods as they cannot be deposited in the landfill; (i.e. make one pile for metals and another pile for non-metal bulk garbage)
- Electronic waste such as computers and printers should also be separated;
- Hazardous material such as paint, oil, windshield wash etc. cannot be picked up; Residents are reminded that those items may be dropped off at Robin Hood Bay any Wednesday or Saturday;
- Bag or box any small items;
- Please box and tape any broken glass and clearly mark on the box "**GLASS**", this is for the safety of the workers;
- Construction material will not be collected (no shingles, drywall nor wood i.e. old decks or fencing etc.)
- Wooden furniture and household items will be collected as part of the bulk pickup;
- Loose items must not be over 4 feet long and should be bundled together;
- Bundled items should not be more than 50 lbs;
- No fishing nets;
- No automotive parts, tires or batteries;
- No concrete;
- No trees, soil, branches or similar yard waste

SUMMER CAMP PROGRAM

HOME BASED BUSINESS

Permission is needed from the Town of Bauline for all businesses. A Home Business is defined as an accessory use of residential dwelling consisting of an occupation or profession which generates revenue for the resident. Office, medical and professional service, personal service and light industry uses may be permitted provided they are carried out as home occupations, business operated in the dwelling, or in a building subsidiary to the dwelling on the same lot, by the occupants of the dwelling. ANIMAL CONTROL

All dogs within the municipality of Bauline should be registered. It is a one-time fee of **\$5.00**. Please drop in at the town office, register your dog and receive your dog tag. Terilynn Farrell is the Animal Control Officer (ACO). If you need to contact Terilynn call **437-6432 ext. 285**, or call the town office at 335-2483. All dogs are to be on a leash at all times especially when walking your dog. Your dog should be kept secure on your property and not able to roam free on other property. When walking your dog, please clean up after your animal. In addition, the Town has received coyote sightings. Please refrain from leaving edible garbage on and around your property. PERMIT TO BURN

Residents preparing to burn brush as part of Clean-Up activities around their properties should note that the 2018 forest fire season started **1 May and will end 30 September, 2018**. A permit to burn is required under the Forestry Act and can be obtained at no cost at Paddy's Pond office, phone number **729-4180**. Materials prohibited include: tires, plastic, treated lumber, asphalt, drywall, demolition, hazard, domestic and biomedical waste, manure, rubber, tar paper, railway ties, paint and paint products, fuel, lubricant containers, used oil, Styrofoam, animal cadavers etc. Information on the forest fire season and regulations are available: www.nr.gov.nl.ca/nr/forestry/fires/index.html.
