POUCH COVE FIRE DEPARTMENT

“Fire Ban” implemented by Fisheries and Land Resources, Gov NL

It appears restrictions have been put into place similar to recent years past and includes a ban on grass burning, brush burning, campfires(open) and personal fireworks

We have been getting many inquiries regarding the ability to enjoy a backyard campfire. Although we are waiting to hear further clarification on what exactly the ban entails, it appears “Approved” outdoor fire places are still permitted as they have been historically during provincial fire bans, unless banned by the municipality.

In the past, an approved fire pit:

- must completely contains the fire;
- is made entirely of non-combustible material and is screened to prevent the escape of sparks and other burning material;
- rests on legs or supports and is placed on a non-combustible area of no less than 1.5 square metres; and - is located not less than of 3.5 metres from the nearest woods, brush or other flammable material.

PCFD will provide updates as more information becomes available.

The Town of Bauline reminds residents during Covid Level 4 while hiking and municipal areas are open for outdoor activities, such as walking, hiking, biking, the playgroup equipment will remain off limits and all recreation facilities are closed to the public. This includes the Bauline Community Centre Centre.

The Town Hall will remain open during our normal hours of operations, but closed to the public.

All facility rentals and Town recreational programming and events are cancelled until further notice.

We will make updates regularly through our website and social media. We appreciate everyone’s understanding and efforts at this time as we work together to reduce the risk of COVID-19 in our community and Province.

BULK GARBAGE PICK UP

There will be no Community Clean up this year; however Bulk Garbage pick-up will be **June 8**. We ask residents to clean up the roadside around your house or pick a section of town to clean as a family. All families who participate and send in a photo of themselves in action cleaning your community will be entered to win a \$150 gift card. Please NOTE:

- Ensure that all your bulk waste is out by the side of the road no later than Sunday Evening **7 JUNE 2020**;
- Metals will have to be separated from bulk goods as they cannot be deposited in the landfill; (i.e. make one pile for metals and another pile for non-metal bulk garbage)
- Electronic waste such as computers and printers should also be separated;
- Hazardous material such as paint, oil, windshield wash etc. cannot be picked up; Residents are reminded that those items may be dropped off at Robin Hood Bay any Wednesday or Saturday;
- Bag or box any small items;
- Please box and tape any broken glass and clearly mark on the box “**GLASS**”, this is for the safety of the workers;
- Construction material will not be collected (no shingles, drywall nor wood i.e. old decks or fencing etc.)
- Wooden furniture and household items will be collected as part of the bulk pickup;
- Loose items must not be over 4 feet long and should be bundled together;
- Bundled items should not be more than 50 lbs;
- No fishing nets;
- No automotive parts, tires or batteries;
- No concrete;
- No trees, soil, branches or similar yard waste
