History/Heritage Committee



Purpose:

The purpose of the Bauline History/Heritage Committee is to preserve, protect, and promote the history, heritage, and cultural identity of the Town of Bauline. The Committee works to encourage community awareness and appreciation of the town's unique historical significance through research, education, preservation initiatives, and community engagement.

Governance:

The Bauline History/Heritage Committee is a standing advisory committee established by Bauline Town Council.

The Committee is accountable to Town Council and operates under the authority granted through Council-approved policies and bylaws. The Committee provides advice and recommendations to Council but does not have independent decision-making authority unless specifically delegated by Council.

Policy:

The Bauline History/Heritage Committee shall operate in accordance with the policies, bylaws, and procedures adopted by Bauline Town Council. Committee members shall comply with all applicable municipal policies, including those related to governance, financial management, procurement, conflict of interest, confidentiality, respectful conduct, and privacy legislation where applicable.

- Promote the preservation and appreciation of the Town of Bauline's history and heritage.
- Identify opportunities to preserve and document the community's historical and cultural legacy.

- Work collaboratively with Town Council, community organizations, and residents on heritage-related initiatives.
- Research and recommend heritage preservation projects and funding opportunities for Council's consideration.
- Provide advice, recommendations, and updates to Town Council on matters related to the community's history and heritage.
